EDITH COVACH, COMPOSER / PIANIST



Edith Aeschbacher-Covach: ARCT Piano Performer and Composer; RCM certified elementary, intermediate & advanced certified theory piano teacher; ORMTA and ACWC affiliate.

Born and raised in Buenos Aires, Argentina. Moved to Canada back in 1995 at the age of 23 with a Piano Professor degree and training in Early Childhood Music studies. While in Argentina, she taught music at her own private studio as well as in several public schools. After settling to a new life in Canada, new language, new family, she has managed to always remain active as a teacher and musician-performer, teaching in her private studio, pianist to her church orchestra and choir and constant projects on the side. Currently a teacher at the Renaissance School of the Arts in Waterloo, Ontario and at her private studio.

Her ongoing musical activity is broad, going from teaching at her private studio into composing and performing, regular entries to composing competitions in different styles and also busy performing. Her repertoire often includes pieces by Bach, Rachmaninoff, Liszt, Albeniz, Piazzolla -to name a fewand she is often performing in Buenos Aires, Argentina at Conservatory "Carlos Guastavino", where she took her foundational music courses while living there. Edith has accompanied the local Wellington Winds Ensemble and the KWCO at severalPerformances.

Her compositions and arrangements had found a way into local orchestras as well (KWCO,Valhalla Brass Ensemble), her songs performed at Kiwanis festivals, Love for Music Marathon and several studio recitals. Edith also has attended composers Workshops, havinghad the chance to work personally with composers such as Gary Kulesha, Christopher Norton and Kevin Lau to name a few.

Constant improvement and development are a MUST for Edith, balanced by the enjoyment thatmaking music, better music, brings.

AVELEIGH KELLER, PLAYWRIGHT/VOCALIST



Aveleigh Keller is a graduate of Sheridan College's Bachelor of Music Theatre Performance, and has been performing professionally since the age of 10. She's worked all over Ontario, including the Stratford Festival, Drayton Entertainment, The Grand Theatre, and the Rose Theatre. She also loves Oxford commas.

Beginning as a playwright, Aveleigh's first play – Dancing Under a Blanket – was produced in 2019 to positive reviews. More recently, Aveleigh has been exploring different mediums of storytelling with digital media and film. Her directorial film debut was in 2021 with her film Blue Light Glasses – which she wrote, edited, and co-

produced alongside Unwrap Theatre. Currently in Toronto Film School for screenwriting, she is interested in how live theatre and digital media can intersect and help tell stories in new and innovative ways.





Where does creative energy come from and what inspires an artist to produce meaningful works? Let's explore! Let's start with two themes that have inspired artists and stood the tests of time. The first theme is an easy one and one we often find ourselves persuaded to explore, it is love. The second theme is not so easy, it is nature and feelings we often cannot see.

Today we will introduce you to music composer Edith Covach and playwright Aveleigh Keller.

DIRECTOR'S NOTES

The first part of our program is about love. Artists often are inspired to compose a song, write a poem, paint a portrait and yes, even knit, sew and quilt for loved ones. This has gone on for decades, and centuries. The second part of the program will explore the unseen, outlining the beautiful contours of nature, and connecting with what a set of piano pieces describe as "Little Sighs", which are states of the soul.

Edith has written many songs that demonstrate love for her land, love for her companion, love for her children and love for nature. She has even demonstrated love in her piano cycle Pequeños Suspiros – Little Sighs. This week's Neighbourhood Series will be premiering three of Edith's works, two a cappella songs (vocal works without accompaniment), Compania and La Espera and a pop song Tell Me written in English for her daughter when she first left home. Edith will be performing three of five works she composed for piano and rearranged for two digital pianos accompanied with dance by Kaleigh and Alten.

Aveleigh has written several plays. Aveleigh wrote, produced and premiered our very first show back in 2019, Dancing Under a Blanket. For this series, I asked Aveleigh to adapt a scene from an old romance Opera that premiered in 1883 – you will no doubt recognize the tune! Sit back and enjoy a little time travel across 140 years to present. You be the judge....have humans evolved when it comes to love and nature?

Thank you Edith and Aveleigh for your commitment to providing new and creatively crafted writings for artists to feel inspired to perform and accompany. It has been my pleasure to learn, curate and bring these beautiful works to life for you and audiences to enjoy.

Through their work as an actor, choreographer, writer, and producer, Alten has worked on projects across Canada including with institutions such as CBC, Global TV, The Harbourfront Centre, Arts Club, Theatre Passé Muraille, and Guelph Dance, as well as for companies overseas such as NBCUniversal and the Lebanon Film Festival.

In 2019, Alten founded Unwrap Theatre, a nonprofit arts company that supports artists in building independently sustainable careers and connects their work with the public.

Alten's work has been recognized with awards including the Buddies in Bad Times' Queer Emerging Artist Award, an ArtworxTO Emerging Artist Award, a Denny Award, as well as other nominations and shortlists.

Alten most often works with stories and performances which push characters to extreme limits, where they believe the core of our humanity is revealed.

Cassandra Amorim


